


The Hub is live!

We are pleased to announce as of September 2017 we are now operating in Ashford, Canterbury and Shepway. 2016/17 Wellbeing Measurement Framework Survey

Around 10,000 Kent young people Years 7 and 9 recently completed a survey as part of our national research. Results indicated strengths for both Year 7 and Year 9 students in the areas of goal setting, empathy, support at home, peer support and community support. Results also indicated that Year 7 students appear to experience good emotional wellbeing than Year 9.

Students eligible for free school meals or with a statement of Special Education Need were significantly less likely to report good wellbeing. Males were more likely report poorer wellbeing in comparison to females. A high proportion of students reported attention difficulties. Year 9 males scored significantly better for emotional difficulties, managing emotions, coping with stress, goal setting and participation in community, in comparison to females.



Young people from organisations like youth groups, clubs and schools can apply for a grant of up to £1000 assessed by young people. This month, 17 *Pay It Forward* grants were approved. The next round of funding will be open soon. Contact HeadStart@kent.gov.uk for further details


